THE HISTORY OF BON SECOURS

In 1824, Bon Secours was founded by Josephine Potel and her eleven companions as a religious congregation in post revolution Paris.

Their Mission: to care for the sick, the dying and their families in their own homes, within a Catholic ethos. This new form of healthcare was radical – it was a new model of ministry for religious women. Bringing the healing love of Christ to the sick was the core mission of these founding Sisters.

Having grown rapidly in France, Bon Secours spread to Ireland in 1861, their first international presence, reflecting the close historical links between Ireland and France at that time. From the first footfall of those five Bon Secours Sisters, who arrived in Dublin in 1861, the congregation has been providing "Good Help" to the people of Ireland. Further foundations in Cork, Tralee and Galway sowed the seeds for our Health System as it is today. A reputation for compassionate, quality care for the sick ensured the success and growth of Bon Secours.

In 1915 the Sisters responded to the needs of the times by opening their first hospital, Bon Secours Cork. This was a very significant move for the Sisters in that it began the move from homecare to hospital Care.

In February 1993, the Sisters of Bon Secours, again responding to the needs of the time, established our Health System. The purpose of this Health System was to promote and extend the work started by those 12 young women in France in 1824.

Today, Bon Secours Health System is the largest independent healthcare provider in Ireland comprising a network of modern JCI accredited hospitals with world-class medical treatment

facilities. Locations include; Cork, Dublin, Galway, Tralee, together with a Care Village in Cork and a Consultation Centre in Limerick.

As a leader in healthcare, the mission of Bon Secours Health System is to provide compassionate, quality health care to our patients and their families within a Catholic ethos.

The story of Bon Secours is a story of faith, courage, determination, vision, and of a willingness to adapt to the needs of the times.

Our staff today are the continuation of this story – custodians of this legacy of care, bringing "Good Help" to the patients who come through the doors of our facilities by delivering "Advanced Medicine and Exceptional Care".

logo was developed from a flower known as the fleur-de-lis and reflects the beginning of the Sisters' Ministry in France in 1824.

It also portrays the cross reaching out to others. It reminds us that we are part of a rich tradition of ministry for the sick.



OVERVIEW OF BON SECOURS HEALTH SYSTEM TODAY

As Ireland's largest independent hospital group, Bon Secours Health System is renowned for the quality of its service provision coupled with a rich tradition in healthcare.

Bon Secours Health System is a not-for-profit organisation with its mission centered on providing compassionate, world-class medical treatment to all those it serves.

With over 2,800 staff, 876 beds, 350 leading consultants, Bon Secours treats in excess of 250,000 patients per year.

Bon Secours Health System is internationally accredited by the Joint Commission International Accreditation Standards for Hospitals (JCI), the leading organisation in the international accreditation of hospitals for quality of and patient safety.

BON SECOURS CORK



Bon Secours Hospital Cork is not only Ireland's largest private hospital but one of the largest private hospitals in Europe. Established in 1915, the Hospital has over 300 beds, employs over 1000 staff and admits approximately 36,000 patients per annum. It is an acute general hospital providing an extensive range of medical and surgical specialties for both adults and children including; oncology, cardiology, orthopaedics, gastroenterology and general surgery.

The Hospital caters for urgent admissions from GPs in both medicine and surgery and has recently commissioned a new Acute Medical Assessment Unit. The Hospital has a fully equipped Intensive Care Unit, Coronary Care Unit, a High Dependency Unit and 7 modern theatres.

Bon Secours Hospital Cork possesses state-of-the-art diagnostic facilities that provides rapid access to tests and results for patients and GPs throughout the Munster region. We are soon to develop radiotherapy services to complete our full range of cancer services. All services are consultant delivered, supported by NCHDs, specialist nursing staff and a broad range of health and social care professionals.

Bon Secours Hospital Cork is a teaching hospital of UCC thereby making a significant contribution to undergraduate teaching in medicine and nursing. The Hospital is proud to hold many quality accreditations including JCI, INAB and ESMO (the European Society for Medical Oncology accreditation).

BON SECOURS DUBLIN



The Bon Secours Hospital Dublin (located in Glasnevin) is JCI accredited and provides acute medical and surgical services.

The hospital with its 178 beds and 4 modern theatres, has a thriving day case unit, interventional cardiology suite, oncology unit (including breast CA), orthopaedics, along with a coronary care and medical assessment unit.

It provides 3 state-of-the-art endoscopy suites, and is Ireland's first and only private hospital to achieve JAG accreditation. It has strong links with Beaumont Hospital, the RCSI Hospital Group and its academic partner, the RCSI.

BON SECOURS GALWAY



Bon Secours Hospital Galway is a modern stateof-the-art, acute care hospital with a well earned reputation for high quality patient care. Main facilities include; 100 inpatient beds, 22 day care beds, 4 modern theatres, 2 endoscopy rooms and a well equipped radiology department.

It specialises in orthopaedics, urology, general medicine and gastroenterology, providing services in all medical and surgical specialties. It has an Acute Dependence Unit, a Medical Assessment Unit and a new Cardiac Catheterisation Laboratory which will open in early 2017.

BON SECOURS TRALEE



Bon Secours Hospital Tralee is an acute care facility of 150 beds, providing a comprehensive range of modern diagnostic, therapeutic and support services to a catchment area of 170,000 people in the Kerry region. The hospital is accredited by JCI, reflecting state-of-the-art healthcare practices and delivery trends. In addition, it is an affiliated training site for student nurse and medical students.

An updated Diagnostic Imaging Suite and new theatres opened in autumn 2016. Work then commences on a new suite of private consultancy rooms which are due to open in 2017.



BON SECOURS CARE VILLAGE



Bon Secours Care Village comprises St. Joseph's Hospital which has 67 beds and facilitates caring for the older person, for short term, long term, respite, convalescent and palliative care.

Bon Secours Care Village also includes Cedar Lodge, which comprises independent living apartments and facilitates clients that value their independence with support, company and security.

Bon Secours Care Village is located just two miles from the city centre in a tranquil and peaceful setting, surrounded by mature gardens and walkways. Bon Secours Care Village is fully compliant with all HIQA standards and prides itself on its exceptional care.

OUR STAFF



Our mission is to care for the sick and their families. Our staff translate this care into action every day, as they put our values into action in their various roles.

Whether staff interact directly with patients or not, they all play an essential role in the care pathway of the patient.

Our staff are our greatest asset and we are very proud of the exceptional care they provide to our patients. Core to our strategy is further investment in our staff, to ensure we develop and retain our people and continue to attract leaders in their field to work across Bon Secours Health System.

OUR PATIENTS



We serve more than 250,000 patients each year across all our hospitals and our care village.

BACKGROUND & CONTEXT TO THE 2020 PLAN

In 2015, we celebrated the centenary of Bon Secours Hospital Cork, acknowledging the contribution of the Sisters of Bon Secours to healthcare over the past 100 years. Throughout that time the organisation faced many challenges including booms, busts, recessions, depressions, world wars and civil war. Careful planning and innovative strategic development, together with staying true to the guiding mission of 'Good help to those in need' were the foundation stones of sustaining and growing the organisation whatever the challenge.

As we now plan the next 100 years in terms of sustainability and growth, we do so in the context of current and predicted challenges and opportunities which we must factor into our strategic thinking.

Some context issues for our 2020 Plan include:

- After several years of recession and austerity Ireland is in the early stages of economic recovery. This represents opportunity for growth and increased collaboration.
- The health insurance market is extremely dynamic in terms of providers and products. This is evidenced by recent changes in ownership of the medical insurance providers and to the fact that there are now in excess of 400 products in the marketplace.
- Changing demographics and in particular an aging population represents both a threat in terms of the ever increasing costs of healthcare but also opportunities in terms of demand for healthcare.

- The increasing cost of healthcare is making affordability more difficult for people and requires us to be increasingly efficient in the delivery of our exceptional care.
- The public system is seriously challenged to meet the healthcare needs of the population and this represents an opportunity for collaboration in the future.
- We operate in a more competitive landscape within the private healthcare market. The past number of years has seen a number of new entrants to the private healthcare market.
- The Irish healthcare system is experiencing acute shortages of key resources, in particular nurses and consultants.
- The healthcare sector has seen increased regulation over the past number of years and this is expected to continue.
- The need to continue to invest in our infrastructure and facilities along with our innovative practice to benefit our patients.
